Brief synopsis of PhD thesis

The thesis contains an experimental and theoretical analysis of threshold public goods games. A theoretical model of success rates in threshold public goods games is presented, which is based on stochastically stable strategies. Unanimous voting on contribution vectors is introduced as an alternative decision-making procedure. The experimental investigation is concerned with distributive fairness if players have heterogeneous marginal contribution costs, transfer payments as a means of welfare-maximizing redistribution, and, respectively, efficiency under threshold uncertainty. The findings are applied to the ongoing climate negotiations.
